CFO Report

Here is the executive summary of the Class of 1970 financial accounts as of April 30, 2025:

- 1. Administrative Fund** has an approximate balance of \$41,000 (estimated after all reunion expenses paid after the date of this report).
- 2. Class of 1970 Gift Fund** has a total balance of \$295,633.
- 3. Class of 1970 NCEA Endowment** has a total balance of \$4,771,541.
- 4. Class of 1970 West Point Cyber Leaders Conference Endowment** has a total balance of \$2,978,178.
- 5. Class of 1970 MacArthur Cup Award for Athletics Endowment** has a total balance of \$492,345.

Here is a list of gifts our Class of 1970 has made to West Point:

1. The Fountain and Serve With Integrity court at Herbert Hall (approximate gift of \$350,000 in 1990).
2. NCEA Endowment net principal of \$2,573,485. Funding began about 1995 and continued until about 2015.
3. Revolutionary War Fortifications project was gifted \$500,000 about 2020.
4. Cyber Leaders Conference Endowment net principal of \$2,206,750. Funding was made in January 2020.
5. MacArthur Cup Award for Athletics Endowment was initially funded in July 2021. Net principal to date is \$458,150.
6. Other smaller gifts include \$40,000 for the 50 Year class affiliation program; \$100,000 for NCEA expenses in 2008 when the endowment was unable to pay for expenses; \$30,000 for the MacArthur Cup Award before the endowment was established; and about \$15,000 to our Gift Fund from the 50 Year Legacy Yearbook.
7. Additionally, numerous classmates have funded various projects and team sports for pistol, rugby, lacrosse, track and cross country, baseball, conferences, and other ways to support West Point.
8. Based on information from AOG, I believe our class has added over \$8 million dollars above our three endowments. This means we, **as a class, have contributed over \$16,000,000 to West Point over the decades since graduation.**
9. Finally, our class has had phenomenal rates of participation with past fund-raising efforts. Let's all give something with this last effort to increase the MacArthur Cup Award Endowment to over \$1 million dollars.
10. Additionally, we just recently contributed \$300,000 to endow ten (10) scholarships with the Army Scholarship Foundation to honor our seven fallen classmates who died in the line of duty and three sons of classmates who died in service to our nation.

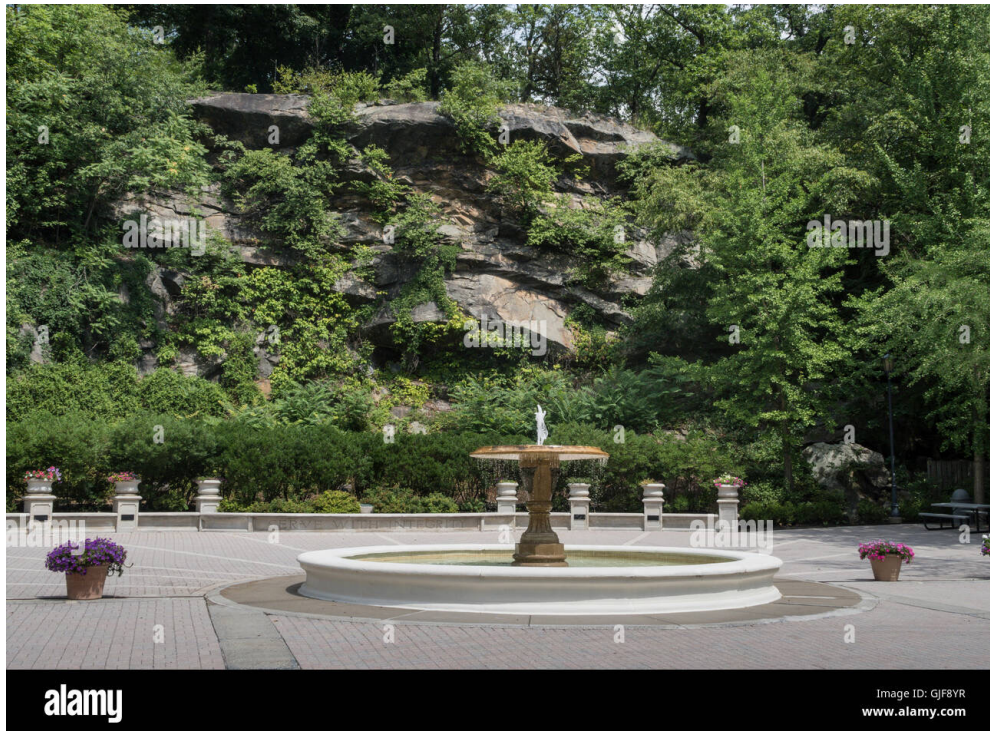
